PRELUDE AND POSTLUDE

Buxtehude's Fugue in C, also known as his "Gigue Fugue", is a simple, yet effective demonstration of Buxtehude's ability to take a sequence of notes and create a jolly dance out of them. The chorale prelude on "We Now Implore the Holy Ghost" is an elegant setting of a popular hymn during Buxtehude's life. Known as an ornamented chorale, its melody weaves in and out of cascading flourishes and scales. Praeludium in A minor is one of the most performed of Buxtehude's praeludia and includes two fugues surrounded by improvisatory passages and pedal solos.
