### TODAY'S MUSIC

The notion of "perfection" in music is always there. Yet, none of us has the same idea of perfection; perhaps singing a hymn without tripping up on a word, or making a musical mistake can be seen as 'perfect,' or perhaps conveying the affect of a choral anthem or organ work to the wider congregation (with or without mistakes) can be seen as 'perfect.' This is before we've even argued whether the score is perfect. Today's anthems speak to this theme, perhaps portraying God as perfect. John Rutter's "Thy Perfect Love" talks of the love Jesus has for us, even if we ourselves fall short of perfection. Samuel Sebastian Wesley's anthem "Thou Wilt Keep Him in Perfect Peace" takes its text from Isaiah 26:3, with additional text from Psalm 139, and 1 John 1, and echoes the same idea as Rutter; we honor and put our trust in a perfect God. Knowing this is a gentle reminder to be kind to ourselves, but to always strive for the best we can do.
