

TODAY'S MUSIC

As we enter Worship on the final Sunday of Advent, perhaps the light is at its dimmest. Perhaps the anticipation of what lies ahead is too great to bear, or perhaps we sit waiting for good news amidst the chaos of the world around us. "Advent 4" to me is a turning point. We begin to focus our attention on the birth of the Christ Child as we focus on the role of Mary. The birth is imminent. Our music reflects this, first with a jubilant work by the Estonian composer Arvo Pärt. Bogoróditse Djévo, translated as Hail Mary (commonly sung as "Ave Maria" in Latin), is a short work that honors and celebrates Mary. Marian feasts are of the highest importance in the Estonian Orthodox Church, and thus this work pays homage (quickly!) to the Mother of God. Nova, nova is a newly composed work by the established composer, Iain Farrington; merging 15th-century text with 21st-century jazz harmonies and rhythms. The anthem recounts the story of the Angel Gabriel, but perhaps through a different lens than we're used to hearing. We end back in darkness, with the brooding sonorities of Louis Vierne's opening movement of his first Organ Symphony (Op. 14) as the postlude.
