TODAY'S PRELUDE

Today's prelude, "Grand Dialogue in C" opens with a long, low pedal tone. The sonorities that follow are beautiful: uncluttered, majestic, at times dramatic. A feature of the Dialogue is alternation between two different registrations of the organ: the cromorne family of reeds and the trompette family of reeds. Born in Lyons in 1669, the composer Louis Marchand was a virtuoso organist and harpsichordist. At 14, he became organist at Nevers Cathedral. He went to other positions in French churches throughout his life and spent four years on a concert tour in Germany, allegedly dodging personal and financial problems. Marchand served for a time as a court organist for Louis XIV, whose patronage furthered the development of French organ music and the instruments on which they were played.

The text of our opening hymn, "The God of Abraham Praise," has a long and complex history, beginning with a set of 13 articles of Jewish faith, known as the Yigdal, based on the imagery of Daniel 7 as written down by Moses Maimonides in the 12th century and versified around 1400 by Daniel ben Judah. In its sung form, this text continues to play a significant role in synagogue and domestic worship in numerous Jewish traditions. The version sung by Christians was written by Thomas Olivers after he heard cantor Meyer Lyon sing it in Hebrew in the Great Synagogue in London. Oliviers' adaptation into English deployed 12 stanzas. The present first and third stanzas are derived from his first and sixth. The melody, "Leoni" first appeared in the 18th century and is based one of the traditional melodies for the Hebrew *Yigdal* which cantor Meyer Lyon transcribed for Thomas Olivers. "Leoni" has found its way into several pieces of classical music, such as Rossini's oratorio *Moses in Egypt* and Smetna's *The Moldau*.

BULLETIN COVER

Our four-year-olds learn about God's ongoing story through the unique curriculum, "Young Children and Worship," adapted from Maria Montessori's teaching methods. The curriculum's wooden figures and objects shown on this summer's bulletin covers are used repeatedly to help children identify a pattern. Today's story is set in the desert, a place where many important things happen. You'll notice Abraham and Sarah have built an altar in the desert sand. Our desert sand is in our "desert box" and we explain to our young children that because the desert is a unique place where God and people meet, we need to have a small piece of it in our room.

Our summer sermon series is based upon the Old Testament stories we teach to our youngest children, hoping that children in worship will recognize them and the child in each of us will recall the foundational biblical witness for the life of faith.
