# Student Serve Leadership Student Leadership Team Description

#### Why Should I Do It?

Student Serve Leadership team has 3 primary purposes:

- 1. Discipleship
- 2. Learn Leadership Principles
- 3. Gain Leadership Experience

#### **Discipleship**

- → Students will participate in Leadership lessons on Wednesday night
- → There will be weekly check-ins on life and faith
- + Students will have more personal time and interaction with the Youth Ministry staff

#### **Learn Leadership Principles**

- → There will be monthly lessons from the Leadership365 curriculum
- → Please see monthly topics covered
- → Students will have monthly access to an adult leadership advisor from the Youth Ministry Council

#### **Gain Leadership Experience**

- ★ Each student will have weekly ministry responsibilities
- + Students will work in leadership teams and will have the responsibility of dreaming, planning, developing, and carrying out a ministry opportunity

In addition, Student Serve is a great activity to put eventually put on college applications. It also builds a foundation for future job interviews and work experience.

# Student Serve Leadership Monthly Leadership Training

#### What Will I Learn?

Every month, students will have an interactive time with our Youth Ministry staff. Below, you will see the monthly teaching topics and a description.

October | Leadership Design

Description: Your foundation of leadership is built on who you are. Each person will lead differently based on how they were created and how God has specifically gifted them. This information will determine how we act in different situations and allow us to serve others through our strengths.

November | Debrief of Leadership Wiring and Spiritual Gifts Assessment

**December** | Balancing Act

Description: We all know a great visionary who has acted inappropriately. We also know the leader who wants everything done right but can't execute the vision. The key here is balance. A leader must learn how to execute skills, but also be someone of great character. Students will take home a leadership skills test that will be brought back and debriefed in the January session.

January | Debrief of Leadership Skills Test and Character Trait Assessment

February | Mission First-People Always

Description: God has given us a mission and the mission is people. Leaders generally value one over the other, thus neglecting the one they do not value. But in leadership, tasks and relationships are tied together. Great leaders understand this and work hard to care for people, while still reaching goals. Students will take home one test that will be brought back and debriefed in the March session.

March | Debrief of Leadership Style Assessment

April | Creative Leadership

Description: God has given us the gift of creativity. While we express it differently, creativity is something we all have within us. Leaders use creativity in what they do. Students will have an opportunity to explore their own creativity and reflect on how this relates to leadership.

May | Debrief of Creative Leadership and Year-in-Review

## Student Serve Leadership Leadership Teams Descriptions

All Student Serve leaders will participate weekly on our ministry teams.

#### Media Team

The goal of this team is to develop media content for our weekly Youth Gathering. In addition, this team will review communication to youth and parents.

#### **Hospitality Team**

The goal of this team is to provide hospitality leadership on Sunday morning by greeting and hosting other students.

#### **Prayer Team**

The goal of this team is participate in regular prayer for the concerns of students and families in the Youth Ministry.

#### Worship Team

The goal of this team is to provide the worship music for our Youth Gathering. Students will come early on Sunday morning to rehearse and prepare the stage.

# Student Serve Leadership Expectations of a Student Leader

Leadership demands expectations. Leaders will be held to a high standard. As a result, the youth ministry insists that student leaders meet certain requirements. Fortunately, students are more than ready to be challenged.

The profile of a student leader is...

- → Humility
- → Growing spiritually
- → Genuine and transparent
- → Publicly supports leadership and their decisions
- → Makes visitors feel welcome at events and programs
- → Participates in major events
- + Genuinely friendly
- + Constantly looks for opportunities to share their faith
- → Has a good reputation with peers

Those participating in Student Serve are expected to be the most faithful and consistent participants in the youth ministry. Leaders are present! While noting that there are times when one cannot be present, Student Serve leaders are expected to faithfully attend the following:

- → Sunday Morning Youth Gathering/ Sunday School.
- → Student Serve weekly meetings on Wednesday nights.
