



In light of recent events, here are ways for you to engage in the work of justice and peace:

HEEDING GOD'S CALL. As one of our Peacemaking Committee's partner, Heeding God's Call is a faith-based movement and organization to prevent gun violence. Their goals focus on taking specific actions such as educating the public about illegal gun trafficking, persuading gun retailers to not sell guns to those who may resell them on the criminal market, and uniting and motivating people and communities of faith to become activists against gun violence. Sponsored by Heeding God's Call and Religious Leaders Council of Greater Philadelphia, this event offers multiple memorial and advocacy activities, including a witness walk in Center City, a Memorial to the Lost T-shirt display, and an interfaith service honoring those taken by gun violence in 2021. INTERFAITH VIGIL FOR RACIAL JUSTICE. Sun., June 12, 1:00 p.m., Bethel AME Church, 163 Sheldon Lane, Ardmore. Attend Bethel AME Church's longstanding "Memorial to the Lost" service to honor those who have been lost to gun violence. The service will focus on the Emanuel 9 Massacre, the church shooting in Charleston, South Carolina, which happened on June 17, 2015, but it also will include moments dedicated to the Buffalo and Uvalde victims. NATIVE PLANT PROJECT. Prioritizing native plants on the BMPC campus and in backyard gardens, the newest initiative from the BMPC Environmental Justice Committee, offers opportunities to better understand the importance of native plants that support local insects, birds, and other creation allies. Increasing biodiversity is a vital task that all of us can do. It's easy, inexpensive, and helps to create a holy greenway for native species. New plant markers with QR codes have been placed around the church campus to help identify native plantings.
