

Though authorship is anonymous, *My Lord, What a Mornin'* was written and composed by free Black people in the early nineteenth century. The text is full of biblical imagery of the second coming of Jesus. While it expresses awe and dread of the falling stars, it is also hopeful that God's promised justice has finally arrived, and even "the nations underground" are included in the promise. Harry T. Burleigh, one of the most renowned of the spiritual arrangers, creates a three part setting of this spiritual that has become iconic in the canon of spirituals.
