**HOUSING SUPPORT FOR A LOCAL REFUGEE.** The BMPC Refugee Committee has been working closely with a family who needs a new housing arrangement starting on Jan. 1, 2022. A single mother, who has received formal asylum status in the United States, seeks housing for herself and two children (ages 5 and 3). She needs an apartment or house with two bedrooms at an affordable price and near public transportation. She works full time as a child care worker at a school in Ardmore. Her current housing is available only through this December as it is through a local church. She is from Guinea, West Africa, and speaks her native language, French, and English. She has been in the United States for two years and can provide excellent references for her character and dependability. She is a lovely, resilient, determined and delightful young woman.
