



Throughout its history the church has struggled to be faithful to God in different political situations: under persecution, as an established arm of the state, or in separation from it.

We believe God rules over both state and church.

We must confuse neither with the Kingdom of God.

We must not identify the Christian faith

with any nation's way of life

or with opposition to the ideologies of other nations.

We hold that Christians are to be law-abiding citizens unless the state commands them to disobey God.

We should not expect the state

to impose Christian faith by legislation, or to give the church a privileged position.

The church must be free to speak to the state, neither claiming expert knowledge it does not have, nor remaining silent when God's Word is clear.



In light of recent events, here are ways for you to engage in the work of justice and peace:

INTERFAITH VIGIL FOR RACIAL JUSTICE. Today, 1:00 p.m., Bethel AME Church, 163 Sheldon Lane, Ardmore. Attend Bethel AME Church's longstanding "Memorial to the Lost" service to honor those who have been lost to gun violence. The service will focus on the Emanuel 9 Massacre, the church shooting in Charleston, South Carolina, which occurred on June 17, 2015; but it also will include moments dedicated to the Buffalo and Uvalde victims. The outdoor service will be held in person at the church, or, if weather does not permit, via Zoom. For more information about the service, contact AliciaFranklin@bmpc.org.

LETTER WRITING CAMPAIGN. Today through Sun., June 26, Ministries Center Court. Looking for a way to take action against gun violence? There will be a letter writing station set up in the Ministries Center Court where you may write and sign a letter to state legislators and congressional representatives of Montgomery, Delaware and Chester Counties urging them to take action on current gun-related bills. HEEDING GOD'S CALL. As one of our Peacemaking Committee's partners, Heeding God's Call is a faith-based movement and organization to prevent gun violence. Their goals focus on taking specific actions such as educating the public about illegal gun trafficking, persuading gun retailers to not sell guns to those who may resell them on the criminal market, and uniting and motivating people and communities of faith to become activists against gun violence.
