

Music Notes

Today's choral setting of The Lord's Prayer was composed in 1977 by Maurice Duruflé. It originally was written for solo voice and organ, and also could be sung by a congregation. In 1978, Duruflé arranged the work for soprano, alto, tenor and bass. Notre Père is Duruflé's last composition, the only work he composed between his accident in 1975 and his death in 1986, and the only one he composed in the French language. Notre Père is a gentle, heartfelt expression of the text.
