As we prepare to celebrate Earth Day, join us to view the documentary “Return of the River,” which reveals an inspiring story of the Klallam tribe restoring the Elwha River and its ecosystem in Washington State by breaking down the Glines Canyon Dam. The Klallam people relied heavily on the river for their main food source, so when the dam was built, it left them powerless and starving. Almost 100 years later, the Klallam people fought to get the dam removed, and it remains the largest dam removal in U.S. history.

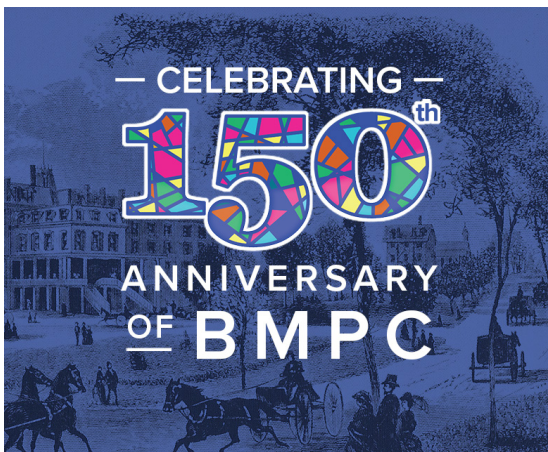
